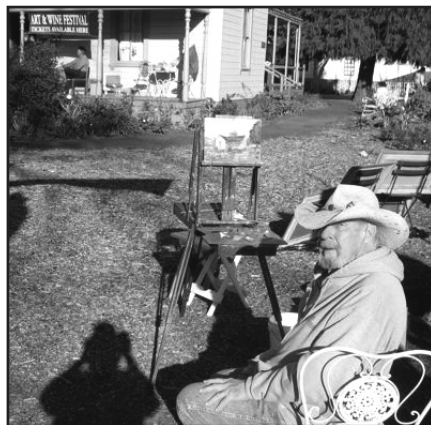

With a glorious break in the wet weather, after Friday's kick-off dinner, four hundred enthusiastic ticket holders enjoyed our Cambria Wine and Art Festival weekend January 29th, 30th and 31st. This year's event was the eighth annual Wine and Art Festival and was the best one yet, according to Chamber of Commerce President **Mel McCulloch**. Instead of having all the events at one venue this year, there were two, as both the Veterans' Hall and the Cambria Historical Museum were used. The businesses at both ends of town reported a significantly increased number of visitors connected with the festival.

The Saturday Silent Auction drew one hundred and three works of art and had a record fifty-one sales thanks to the hard work of **Jackie Chen-Evens** and her committee. More art sales were made at the Sunday Artists' Faire with visitors commenting on the "really fun" weekend they had, tasting delicious wines and viewing great local art. Jackie Chen-Evens was the official chair/coordinator for the Allied Arts portion of the Festival. She had lots of help from **Jim and Pat Babcock**, co-chairs for the past seven years.
