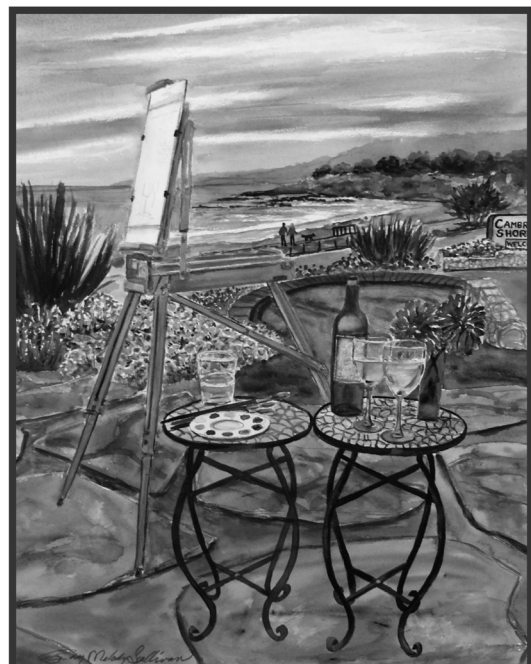

Member Program Series - Part V

Oil and pastel artist **Anne Laddon**, pictured above, will be the next presenter for Allied Arts Bimonthly Program Series, to be held on Sunday, November 20th at 2:00 p.m. in conference room #1 at the Cambria Center for the Arts. Anne, who calls herself a “color junkie”, and is known for her bright, vibrant, plein air paintings will demonstrate her technique as well as talk about her experience in the art world as a 30 year professional artist.

Laddon began her art career in San Francisco as a graphic designer for an ad agency. This background served her well when she moved with her husband to the Washington DC area here she helped found a funky artists center with 10 other artists called the “Torpedo Factory” in Alexandria Va. Laddon produced limited edition serigraphs. From that small beginning of 10 artists in 1974 the Torpedo Factory now has a 208 artist membership.

Moving back to California in 1985 Laddon became more interested in oil painting and pushing her colors to the limit. She came to love plein air painting in our beautiful county participating in the San Luis Obispo Plein Air Festival and opening a studio gallery in Cambria before moving to Paso Robles. Using some of the lessons learned at the Torpedo Factory, she founded the non-profit “Studios on the Park” in Paso Robles in 2007, an organization of artists who work in a variety of media. Laddon feels very strongly that “making a difference” is an important part of Studios on the Park. She started two main programs which have enriched the art experience of the Paso Robles area. Once a year, Studios on the Park produce the “Art Festival in the Park”, which includes all the arts (dance, theater, painting, etc.) For the second program, all the artists participate in a “Kids Art Smart” (K-5th grade) program giving free instruction in various arts to school children in the Paso Robles area.

Paint Workshop

Gaye Adams is an internationally known oil painter with quite a following both in the U.S. and in Canada, where she lives. Gaye is offering a plein air class, weather permitting, Nov. 18th through the 21st in Santa Barbara.

This workshop will focus on the essentials of painting the landscape on location, and will cover the following:

- Creating strong design from the basic elements present in the landscape.
- Creating a workable painting set-up with your gear - dealing with the wind and the elements.
- Simplifying values and shapes to create a compelling and convincing painting.
- Getting the essential elements down in a timely and efficient manner before the light changes drastically.

Other topics such as color mixing, brush handling, etc. will be tackled as time permits. On the last day there will be a group critique.

Although Gaye will work in oil, students may work in the medium of their choice and the cost is \$300 per student.

Sara Blair Field had a hand in at least three winning "scarecrows".

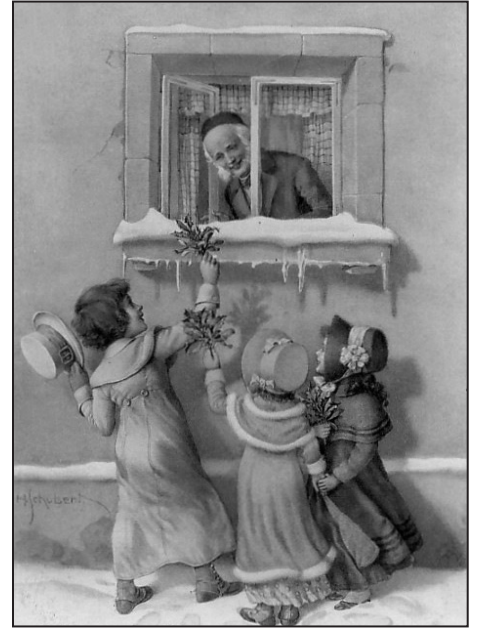
It's good to see Allied Artists get their well deserved recognition even outside of Cambria Center for the Arts.
